



National Cadet League

The club entered three teams into this season's NCL, with the opening round of matches taking place in November. In past years, we have played at Cippenham as part of the Southern Zone, but this time we were assigned to the South Midlands Zone playing at the Westfield Table Tennis Centre, Wellingborough, Northants.

Our A team of George Thorn, Satveer Pawar, Inderjeet Pawar and Heidi Oestricher playing in division one started their campaign against Bedford Modern A but found themselves on the receiving end of a 1-5 defeat. With Satveer sitting this match out it was left to younger sister Inderjeet to bag our only win. Next up was Knighton Park and this time we went a game better going down 2-4. Wins here for Satveer and Heidi. A win against St Neots A by a margin of 4-2 and we were up and running A good team performance with all our players getting on the scoresheet. Unfortunately, this did not last as we succumbed to Rugby again 2-4 with both Satveer and Inderjeet getting a win a piece. Finally, we finished the day on a real high with a 6-0 drubbing of WDHA Cadets. Averages after weekend 1;

Meanwhile, in division two, our B team were sweeping all before them winning four from five matches and only slipping up against Westfield A there gaining a 3-3 draw.
